CASA MYRNA UNVEILS NEW STATEWIDE AD CAMPAIGN

Casa Myrna Vazquez, Greater Boston's leading provider of shelter and supportive services to victims of domestic violence, will launch its 4th statewide transit ad campaign to help raise awareness about the issue, which affects one in four women in their lifetimes.

The ads (previewed below) run throughout May on the red, orange, and silver lines on the MBTA in **Boston** and on buses in **Haverhill, North Andover, Lawrence, New Bedford, Fall River, Brockton, Pittsfield, and Springfield**. With English, Spanish, and Portuguese versions, the ads aim to connect victims to SafeLink, the agency's statewide 24/7 domestic violence hotline (877-785-2020). Since the first of the year, SafeLink has answered over 3,000 calls from residents of Boston.

The mass transit ad campaign will be unveiled at Casa Myrna's *Community of Conscience* breakfast at the Omni Parker House Hotel from 7:30 – 9:00 am on **May 12**th, featuring remarks by **Attorney General Coakley** and **Mayor Menino**. Casa Myrna represents the only domestic violence organization in Massachusetts doing statewide outreach about the issue at this level.
